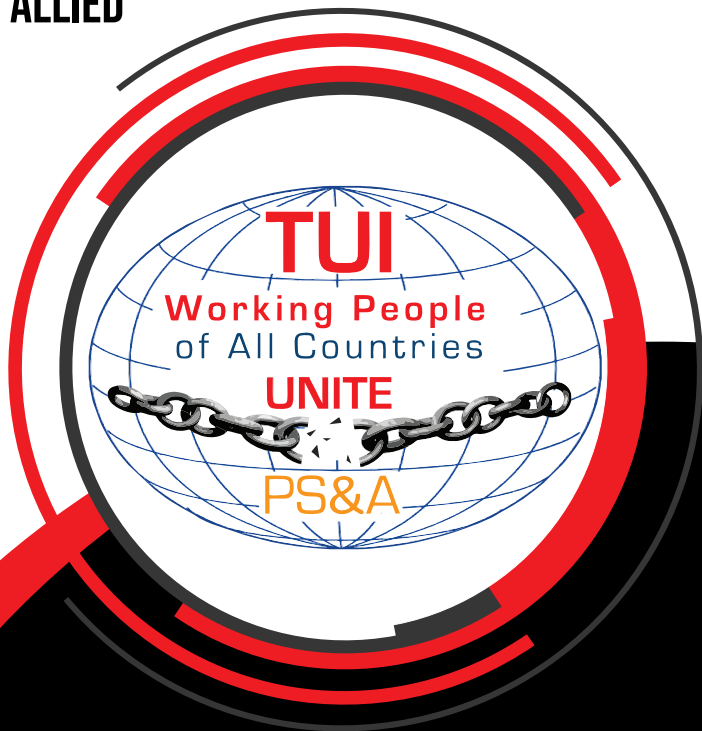

1949 – 2023 SEVENTY FOUR (74) YEARS OF UNBROKEN REVOLUTIONARY TRADE UNIONISM

The Trade Union International Public Service and Allied (TUI PS&A) is a section of the World Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU) representing public service and allied sector workers to maintain permanent contact with member organisations of the WFTU.

Article 13 of the WFTU Constitution spells out the role of the Trade Union Internationals (TUIs) which form part of the WFTU structure with their own constitutions and policies that are in harmony with that of the WFTU. The WFTU have eleven Trade Union Internationals (TUIs).

Our Trade Union International (TUI) was founded at a conference in East Berlin on October 29, 1949 as the International Union of Trade Unions of Postal, Telephone and Telegraph Workers. The name was changed to the Trade Union International of Public and Allied Employees (TUI-PAE) in 1955 during a conference in Vienna when it broadened its scope to include workers in the health, finance and public administration areas.

The TUI-PAE had three level structures with the International Congress being the highest organ, Directive Committee being the second highest organ in between congresses and day-to-day activities led by the Executive Bureau and Secretariat based in East Berlin. There were five branch commissions for the different sectors of the union represented by posts and telecommunications, bank employees, local public servants and public administration.

In 1957, the headquarters for the organization were reported to be at 0.17 Fritz-Heckert-Straße 70, East Berlin. In 1978, its address was reported as 47 Französische Straße, Postfach 1322 DDR 108, East Berlin up until 1985. In 2009, it was reported as SRTVS – Quadra 701 – Bloco O – Sala 1512 – Ed. Multiempresarial, Brasília, Federal District, Brazil. In 2015, it was reported as Via Monte Camicia, 14, 65125 Pescara, Italy. From 2019 to date, the headquarters are reported to be at 33 Hoofd Street, Braampark, Braamfontein, Johannesburg, 2000, South Africa.





TUI Aims

The TUI is composed of all affiliates, associate themselves with class-oriented and principles of the WFTU, organizing in public service and allied sector of different countries in all continents of the world. As an arm of a class oriented, our TUI is responsible for WFTU work, particularly the relevant sections of its program to public services and allied sector.

It aims to unite all workers and affiliates in the sector and also pursue their interests and demands, further seek to facilitate solidarity, networking and collaboration among unions on the global stage.

In line with WFTU political posture, the TUI-PS&A is rooted in class oriented trade unionism and believes in trade union struggles that are inseparable from class struggle. While on the other hand, it welcomes all workers and affiliates irrespective of their political, religious and cultural background and composition of its members, and strongly opposed to capitalism, imperialism, fascism, racism, patriarchy and any other forms of exploitation and discrimination.

In 1955, TUI-PAE claimed 6.8 million members at its Vienna international congress. In 1977, it claimed 24.1 million members in 104 member organizations. In 1985, this had grown to 29 million in 104 affiliates in 44 countries, while in 2020 it stood at 20 million members in 50 unions in 34 countries. Today, it claims to be more than 31 million members in 104 unions in 32 countries.

XIV International Congress

The XIV International Congress is taking place on the 21st to 23rd November 2023 in Bogota, Colombia, expected to be attended by 300 delegates drawn from 104 affiliates in 32 countries under the theme: *"Defend Collective Bargaining and Fight Privatisation, to reinforce International Working - Class Solidarity Against Capitalism and Imperialism"*.

It is important to note that the XIII International Congress held on the 16th to 17th November 2019 in Larnaca, Cyprus was attended by 95 delegates from 37 affiliates coming from 22 countries.

The above statistics show a significant growth from the last congress with 205 more, 66 more affiliates and 10 more countries. This



International Congress is expected to adopt policy positions in a form of perspectives for the first in history of TUI, namely: *On imperialism, on public service world outlook, on COVID-19 pandemic, on strategy for Africa and the Strategic Perspective and Priorities*. The congress will further receive a political overview and organisational assessment report from its General Secretary, Comrade. Zola Saphetha during plenary sessions in order to ground discussions and deliberations of the congress.
